 the same though your Libellant with as much Expedition as she could
 did set off and pursue her Journey to Annapolis in order to procure
 a caveat as aforesaid to be entered but the said Executors hearing of or suspecting
 her Intention having travelled all Night prevented the executing
 of this her design. In tender Consideration whereof and forasmuch as
 this is a matter properly Cognizable and Believable in this honourable
 Court to the end therefore that the said John Mafsey the Elder and John
 Hadley the Elder upon their respective Corporal Oaths may true and
 Perfect Answer make to all and singular the Premises as fully as if
 the same were herein again interrogated and repeated to the best of
 their respective Remembrance Knowledge and belief and that in
 particular the said John Mafsey and John Hadley may answer and
 set forth whether the said John Gibb was of sound & disposing Mind
 Memory and understanding at the Time of his Making & Publishing
 the Will aforesaid and that the said Will may by Sentence of this honourable
 Court be declared null and void and that the Letters Testamentary that
 have been obtained by the aforesaid John Mafsey and John Hadley as aforesaid
 may be revoked and that Letters of Administration may be granted
 to your Libellant as next of Kin to the aforesaid John Gibb and that your
 Libellant may have and receive such further and other Relief in
 the Premises as the nature of the Case doth or may require and
 shall consist with Justice Equity and good Conscience May it
 please your honour the Premises considered to grant unto your
 Libellant His Lordships most gracious Writ of Citation to be directed to
 the said John Mafsey the Elder and John Hadley the Elder of Queen Anns
 County thereby commanding them and each of them at a certain Day and
 under a certain Point therein to be limited personally to be and
 appear before your honour In this Honourable Court then and there
 upon their respective Corporal Oaths true and perfect answer to make
 to all and singular the Premises and further to stand bound
