 having broke was afterward Captain of the Town Guard and that she had
 some fortune left to her, and says that he knows not how long Janes
 Celand has been in Maryland but he has known her live at different
 Times with her Uncle John Gibb and has heard sometimes of her being at
 Philadelphia since his Death and that she has been sometimes at his
 the Deponents house but knows not how employed only believes as other
 Women in her Station and also saith that he has often spoke to John Gibb
 concerning the Libellant when he told him that he knew he not only
