


The Deposition of Abraham Falconer of Kent County aged thirty years and upwards who being sworn and Interrogate particularly saith as follows that he has known the Libellant about eighteen years ago the time she came into Maryland with that he has also known the Respondents ever since he knew himself and also knew John Gibb as long and further saith that near the latter end of August in the year of our Lord seventeen hundred and forty seven he was sent for by John Gibb ^{to} die to make his last Will and accordingly he went to him when John Gibb seemed for a few minutes pretty sensible and told the Deponent to make his Will and to leave his Negroes to his Niece Janet Cleland some few Legacies besides and also ^{rest} of his fortune to his Brother and other Relations in Scotland but in making the Will having occasion to ask him some Questions he seemed quite mad and out of his senses and not capable of making a Will for after the Deponent read the Copy of the Will he seemed quite insensible of what he read to him whereupon he read it a second time to him when the Deponent had passed over a good deal of the Will in order to try John Gibb further he then told him he was very Right from which the Deponent further concludes him not in his senses but that he did not see him sign seal or deliver it
