That John Gibb late of Queen Anns County Gent. Deceased your Petitioners late Master sometime in the year one thousand seven hundred and forty seven made his last Will and Testament and thereby did manumit and set free your Petitioners and did thereby give and devise to your Petitioners great part of his Real and Personal Estates and of his said last Will constituted and appointed James Mapsey sen. and John Hadley sen. both of Queen Anns County Gent: his Executors who after the Death of the said John Gibb proved the said Will in common form as also by the Oaths of the Witnesses thereto and had Letters Testamentary granted to them in Virtue thereof and your Petitioners further Show that a certain Janet Roland since the Death of the said John Gibb and the Letters Testamentary granted as aforesd to the said James Mapsey and John Hadley hath filed her Libell in this honourable Court against the said James Mapsey and John Hadley the Executors in the said Will named in order to obtain a Decree of this honourable Court to Declare the said Will Null and Void to which said Libell the said James Mapsey and John Hadley appeared and put in their answer and the said Janet Roland filed her Replication and a Commission issued out of this honourable Court to examine Witnesses in the said cause and in Virtue thereof the Depositions of several Persons were
