

To the Sixth Interrogatory this Deponent saith that he at the Request of the Libellant Janet Cleland used many Arguments and persuasions with the said John Gibb to induce him to give the said Janet Cleland some part of his Estate to which the said John Gibb gave for answer that the said Janet Cleland had lived with him but that she went from him several times when he had the greatest occasion for her and had behaved so Illly that he was determined not to give her any thing this Deponent further saith that whether the Libellant was serviceable or expensive to the said John Gibb he knows not nor does he know of any other leaving him.

To the Seventh Interrogatory this Deponent saith that he at the Request and by the Directions of the said John Gibb wrot a Will for him whereby he left all his Negroes free and Devised his Lands to them and that the Will now produced to this Deponent he believes to be a true Transcript of the Will by him wrot so far as relates to the said John Gibb's setting his Negroes free and Devising his Lands to them and that he knows nothing more in Relation to it.

To the Eighth Ninth and Tenth Interrogatories this Deponent saith he knows nothing of them.

To the Eleventh Interrogatory this Deponent saith that at the time of his writing the Will aforesaid (having discourse with the said John Gibb on several Subjects as well as in Relation to the manner of making his Will) the said John Gibb appeared to this Deponent to be of sound disposing mind & memory
