

To the Fourth Interrogatory saith he knowes not.

To the Fifth Interrogatory saith that he had several times seen and conversed with the said John Gibb before his Death concerning the Disposition of his Estate and that about six weeks before his Death (to the best of this DepONENTS remembrance) he heard him say he would set his Negroes free.

To the Sixth Interrogatory saith that the Libellant lived in the house and family of the said John Gibb a considerable time but that she left his family and the said John Gibb was displeased with her some time before his Death but upon what occasion does not know nor does he know whether she contributed towards the increase to his Estate or was an expense to him.

To the Seventh Interrogatory saith that he at the Request of the said John Gibb wrote five Wills for him that he wrote the first Will in the last of March or beginning of April in the year the said John Gibb Died but does not remember at what times he wrote the other Wills, that by the first Will he left the most of his Estate to his Brother or Brothers Sons in Scotland and a legacy to the Libellant but what it was he left her does not remember By the second Will the said John Gibb set his Negroes free and gave them all his Estate Except a Legacy to the Libellant of a quantity of Tobacco to be paid her Yearly and a legacy to a Son of Dowdall Thompson but does not remember what the said Legacy to Thompsons Son was by the <sup>third</sup> Will the said John Gibb gave a Negro Woman named Bess her freedom a Legacy to the Son of Dowdall Thompson and the Remainder of his Estate to his Brothers Sons in Scotland upon their paying the Libellant one hundred and fifty or Two hundred Pounds. By the fourth Will the said John Gibb set all his Negroes free and gave them his Estate both Real and Personal Except a legacy to the Son of Dowdall and a Legacy to the Libellant of a yearly sum of Tobacco to be paid her by the Negroes but what sum does not remember
