

To the Third Interrogatory saith that he was present and saw John Gibb sign and seal and heard him Publish and Declare a will to be his last will and Testament that his Name subscribed as a witness to the said will is his own hand writing that he wrote it in the presence of John Gibb the Testator that James Mafsey John Hadley James Mafsey Jun. John Morris and Thomas Hadley were all present when the Testator did sign seal and Publish of said will and that the said James Mafsey Jun. and John Morris wrote their names and Tho. Hadley made his mark as witnesses to of same will

To the fourth Interrogatory saith that the will now produced and shewn to him is the very will that he saw the said John Gibb sign seal and heard him Publish as his last will and Testament that the said John Gibb appeared to this Deponent to be perfectly in his senses when he did so sign seal Declare and Publish the said will and that he believes the said will is all of the hand writing of John Morris for that he saw him write the latter part of it

To the Fifth Interrogatory saith that he several times saw and conversed with the said John Gibb in his health and in his last sickness but does not remember the Particulars of such conversation nor Does he remember to have heard him say anything about the Disposition of his Estate

To the Sixth Interrogatory saith that the Libellant Jennet Beland did live in the house and family of the said John Gibb a considerable Time but does not remember exactly how long that she left him and went to live at Philadelphia but does not know upon what Occasion that he once saw the said John Gibb displeas'd with her in his last sickness when she offered to lift his Legs upon the Bed as he lay down calling her Dog or Rogue and bidding her begone for that she was always a plaguing him and he did not want her in his sight and that he does not know that she increased his Estate or was an Offence to him
