

The Deposition of John Spry of Queen Anne County Planter
 aged thirty two years who being duly and solemnly sworn on the
 holy Evangel of Almighty God

To the first Interrogatory deposes and saith that he
 knows the Parties Libellant and Respondents that he has known
 the Libellant ten years, the Respondent James Maffey fifteen
 years and the other Respondent John Hadley twelve years

To the second Interrogatory saith that he knew John
 Gibb the Respondents Testator and had known him fifteen
 years before his Death, that he died in the Month of October 1747

To the third Interrogatory saith that he was present
 and did see the said John Gibb sign seal and deliver and
 heard him publish and declare a writing as his last will
 on the twenty sixth day of August in the year 1747 but
 does not know the purport of the said will

To the fourth Interrogatory saith that in his Opinion
 the said John Gibb was of sound and disposing Mind and Memory
 on or about the twenty sixth day of August 1747.

To the fifth Interrogatory saith that he never saw or knew
 the said John Gibb to be out of his senses

To the eighth Interrogatory saith that he believes the said
 Bennet Cleland has been in Maryland sixteen years that she lived
 sometimes with the said John Gibb and at other times at Philadelphia
 and that he has seen her knitting and sewing in the house of the said
 John Gibb.

To the ninth Interrogatory saith that he does
 not know any thing more than what he has before declared
 Sworn to before me this 18th

day of March 1750
