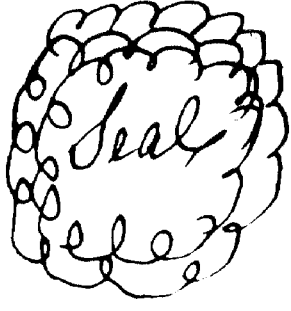


The several Examinations that appear to have been taken and sworn to before the Register of this Court were done in Virtue of the following Commission

Whereas I am upon urgent Business obliged to go to Frederick County Court and sundry Persons have been summoned to attend the Commissarys Court as witnesses in a cause now depending and at issue between Tennet Cleland Libellant and James Maffey Senior and John Hadley Senior Executors of John Gibb Respondents, and as several of the witnesses have not yet been examined in the said cause and it will be inconvenient for them to attend another Court I do hereby authorize and empower you the said Richard Dorsey to take the Examinations of the several witnesses that are now attending and not examined on the Interrogatories filed in the said cause as well on the part of the Libellant as the Respondents given under my hand & Seal of Office this 16 day of March Anno Domini 1750

And thereupon this cause is continued untill next Court and the same day given to the Libellant and Respondents also

At which said next Court (to wit) the second Tuesday of May being the fourteenth day of the same Month Anno Domini 1751 came again the said Parties Libellant and Respondents by their Procurators afo<sup>r</sup> and it is ruled that there be a hearing in this cause next Court or sooner if applyed for, but there being no Application for a hearing in the said cause the same is continued untill next Court and the same day is given to the Libellant and Respondents also

At which said next Court (to wit) the second Tuesday of July being the ninth day of the same Month Anno Domini 1751 came again the said Parties Libellant and Respondents by their Procurators afo<sup>r</sup> and his Honour the Judge having taken time to consider of his decree in this cause doth give on the third Day of August Anno Domini 1751
