

It is moreover my Pleasure, that you enter every year in a Book,
(to be constantly kept in the above^{ment} Office) such your general Account
with such Certificate as is above described, and that you likewise
lodg in the said Office all such Accounts and Papers, or Copies
thereof, as may be laid before my Lieutenant Governor and other
Officers as is above directed.

With respect to such Bills of Exchange taken by you
on my Account as may be protested, you are to keep a separate,
and distinct, Account thereof, notwithstanding, you are to lay the same
before my Officers above mentioned, when they meet & I expect
that you will have your Accounts for the preceding Year,
ending the 29th of September, ready for their Review on the 25th of
March at farthest in every Year.

I desire, and direct, you on my Account, to pay to Governor
Sharpe his Draft for Two Hundred Pounds, for the use of the Rev.
Mr. Thomas Bacon Value Received. Lastly you are to follow all former
Instructions, so far as they are not Repugnant to these.
