Whereupon the Opinion of the Board is, and so they advise; that the Clerk do, without Loss of time, inform Mr. Allen, that it is their Opinion, and Direction to Him, that He do immediately, in His Lordships Name, enter into the said Land, & that Mr. Allen, to prevent Mistake, be served with a Copy of this Order.
