

4th. You are likewise to take care, that all other Bills, the produce of Land Warrants, or otherwise, be made payable by the Drawer, or last Indorser, to His Lordship or Order in London; and this Instruction you are required to adhere to by Reason that Bills made payable in any part of Scotland, or any other part of England, have been attended with many Inconveniences and sometimes with Loss.

5th. As it is necessary for the safety of the Trade that experienced Persons be appointed to pilot Ships up the Bay, as well as up the several Rivers within the Province; you are hereby authorised to give a Branch to any Pilot, who shall apply to you for the same, taking from each the value of Twenty Shillings Sterling of Ammunition to His Lordship's Use, and a Fee of Twenty Shillings Currency to yourself, for making out every such Branch.

6th. Though His Lordship's Quit Rents, and Alienation Fines, are payable in Sterling, yet, as it may not always be in the Tenants power to pay Sterling Cash, and as foreign Coin is more current in the Province, with which they can satisfy His Lordship's demand, for the Ease therefore of the Tenants, and to prevent all unwarrantable Advantage being taken by the Farmers, and Receivers, in the Exchange; you are to take foreign whole Gold at Three Pounds Seventeen Shilling and Six pence Sterling of Ounce, and mill'd Spanish Dollars, when tendered, at Four Shillings and Six pence Sterling a piece; but you are not to take any Gold or Silver in any Payment whatever.
