Frederick Stone

Two days after having received a Commission from His Excellency Governor Sharpe, to be Agent and Receiver General for Lord Baltimore, and very shortly after Mr. Stone had been at the House of The Rev^d Mr. Allen in consequence of my direction, I called at his House to deliver a Letter to Him from the Governor, which Letter, His Excell^{ty} told me contained an Order for the delivery of all Papers relative to the Agents Office. I rap^d at Mr. Allen's Door, upon which a Negro Boy came to me and said his Master was not at Home, whilst I was at the Door Mr. Stone came up, I asked him if he had seen Mr. Allen, he said, that he had, and that he was certain he was within, having left him but a few Minutes before, just as he, Mr. Allen, was going to Dinner: I then upon went with Mr. Stone to the Governor to inform His Excellency with what had pass'd between Mr. Allen and Mr. Stone; From the Governors I sent Mr. Stone with the aforementioned Letter and desired him to deliver it to Mr. Allen or any other Person belonging to his Family.

In pursuance of Mr. Senifers direction I went to Mr. Allens and asked a Negro Boy, who came to the Door, if his Master was at Home, he answered, that he was not, I told him I had a Letter for his Master from the Governor which I wanted to deliver him, the Boy again answered that his Master was not within, but if I would give him the Letter he would carry it to him, upon which I delivered the Letter to the Negro Boy who carried it into Mr. Allens House, this happened to the best of my Remembrance within half an Hour after I left Mr.
