Whereas sundry Persons have hitherto purchased Warrants
and made Surveys with a view of securing Land in the Western
part of the Province beyond Fort Cumberland, but have been
restrained from obtaining Patents on the same by reason of
a prohibitory Order signified to the Judges of the Land office,
and as the Reasons for continuing such prohibitory Order no
longer Subsist: It is hereby Notified to all Persons who have
purchased Warrants or made Surveys for the Purpose above
mentioned, that they lay before His Lordships Board of Revenue
on the Twentieth Day of February next a true State of their
Pretensions, that such Orders may issue for granting them the
Benefit of their respective Warrants, or Surveys, according
to the priority thereof as may be thought just and reasonable.
