On mature consideration of the Steps taken by the Board, to bring Mr. Allen to a Settlement with Them, as His Lordship's Agent, and of his Conduct in consequence thereof. The Board are of Opinion, that as His Lordship has thought proper to intrust them with the Superintendency of his Revenue in this Province, that to discharge that Trust, it is incumbent on them to put Mr. Allen's Bond in Suit, and accordingly Order the Clerk to deliver his Bond to the Attorney General, for that Purpose.
