Mr. Thomas Jones, Farmer of the Quit Rents in Baltimore County, represents to the Board, that, John Morton Jordan, Esq. his Lordships Agent and Receiver General, refuses to accept of any Bill, or Bills of Exchange, in payment of Quit Rents, unless the same shall be endorsed by the Farmers respectively; and Mr. Jordan acquaints the Board, that, whatever may have been the usual custom with former Agents, he cannot accept them on any other Terms, and shall always pass Receipts, conditionally, to be a discharge in case the said Bills of Exchange shall be duly honoured and paid

The Board are of Opinion, that it is the Duty of the Farmers of his Lordships Quit Rents to endorse all Bills of Exchange they may tender to his Lordships Agent in payment for the same, and therefore are not to accept of any Bill or Bills that may, immediately, be made payable to the Lord Proprietor; of which the Clerk to give them Notice

Mr. Newether represents to the Board, that notwithstanding an Order given him on the late Agent, by the Clerk, pursuant to the Directions of the Board; he has not received the Money due him for importing Books, into which the Rentals of the Western Shore are to be transcribed
