think fittest for to execute the office of Sheriff out of which persons the said Chief Judge shall or may appoint one to be Sheriff of the County for the year next following or otherwise may appoint any other not being of the Council and may demand and take such recognizances, or security for the well discharge of his office as he shall think fitt And any partie refusing to obey any the lawfull appointment^s aforesaid may be fined and imprisoned till he submitt This act to endure till the end of the next Assembly

An Act touching Appeals
No appeal shall be admitted from any inferior Court afore judgment given and untill sufficient Security shall be put in to the chief Judge of the said Court for the prosecution of the appeal within a certain time reasonably given & for abiding the judgment of the superior Court and if the superior Judge or Judges find no cause of appeal he or they may find the appellatant & adjudge treble damages to the partie grieved. This act to endure till the end of the next Assembly

An Act appointing the order wherein causes shall be heard and determined

Upon any Court day all causes wherein issue is joyned and both parties present & ready for tryall shall have right to be called to hearing & determination in the order as the date is of their entry. And the keeper of the Record shall enter all causes in the order as the demand is made of entry and if more demand together at one time if it be out of Court The keeper of the Record shall use his discretion for the order of the entry. If in Court the chief Judge in Court shall determine of the order. If divers causes be entered upon Record on one day the flesh on tryng shall distinguish them with figures according to the order of their entry.
