 well and sufficiently Enroll the same with a note of the
 day wherein the same shall be enrolled in a good
 sufficient book in folio to remain in the Custody of
 the Clerk of the same Court for the time being amongst
 the Records of the said Court. To the intent that every
 party that hath to doe therewith may resort unto &
 see the Enrollment and that the same Clerk shall on
 the back of every such deed in a full legible text hand
 make an Endorsement of the day and year of such
 Enrollment and also of the folio of the book in which
 the same is Enrolled and shall unto such endorsement
 sett his hand: Provided allwaies and it is hereby
 Enacted by the authority aforesaid and by the advice
 and consent aforesaid that where the Grantor or Gran-
 = tors Bargainor or Bargainors of any such Man-

 shall happen to be out of this province & within any
 of the Dominions of his Majesty the King of Engl^d
