each side with Gas boards at the Gable ends & pira-  
 medes the whole house to be well Plastered within  
 & the Rooves well sealed & the walls well pointed  
 without with good lime the said prison to be substan-  
 tially built of Stone or brick laid in Lime & sand  
 twenty <sup>four</sup> foot long on the floor within & fifteen foot wide  
 within nine foot high to the plate & a partition in the  
 middle with a floor below paved with flat Stone or  
 brick and another above laid with plank and covered  
 with tile laid in mortar with sufficient lock bars  
 and windows fitt for a prison the said state house &  
 prison to be compleat and ended by the last day of  
 october which shall be in the year of our Lord God  
 1676 And for the building of which state house and  
 prison Be it enacted by the authority aforesaid &  
 with the advice and consent aforesaid that there be  
 levied by the Governour and Council by an Equall  
 assessment upon the Taxable persons of the said  
 Province the sume of three hundred and thirty  
 thousand pounds of Tobacco to be paid to John  
 Quigley his heirs Executors or administrators who  
 hath undertaken to build the said state house and  
 prison by the last day of october which shall be in  
 the year of our Lord God 1676 as aforesaid the same  
 to be levied and paid as aforesaid when the said  
 John Quigley his heirs Executors or Administrators  
 shall fully and compleatly have finished the state  
 house and prison in manner and form as it is  
 and by this act before expressed & Declared  
 provided allwaies that this said John Quigley  
 carry the rooffe of the upper Staires of the State  
 house of sufficient height that there may be  
 convenient Landing and head way (at the top  
 of the Staires
