The humble petition of Phillip Culvert your Lord
ships Judge in Testamentary Causes and John
Jordain the two overseers of the last will of Lew^{ts} Col^l
John Jarboe late deceased

Sheweth

That the said John Jarboe in the year of our Lord
one thousand six hundred seventy one being sick
made his testament in Writing by which he divid
ed his lands amongst all his Children then borne
That recovering of that sickness he lived till he had
another son and daughter borne and in the year
of our Lord 1674 falling sick again the said John
Jordain that upon thurs day morning the fourth of
march 1674 he came to the house of Lew^{ts} Col^l John
Jarboe and finding him sick the said John Jour
dain advised the said Jarboe to settle his affairs
that his wife and children might not after his death
be put to trouble Whereupon the said Jarboe desired
the said Jourdain to send for M^r Edward Clark to come
to him on fryday morning following to make his
will and said he did intend to alter his will made
some years before because he had some children
borne since the making the said will and that
in regard his daughter had some land to be
made good to her by mark Cordea and Walter
Hall Gentlemen he was resolved to have his own
Land now divided between his three sons (Viz)
To John Jarboe the seat of Land where he then
lived with one negro together with his right to
one hundred and fifty acres of the mill Land
where William Medely lived and the mill stones
exchanged with the said William for the one
hundred and fifty acres where the said Willm
now lives as also one equal share with his bro
ther Sister and Mother of the latte horses and
mares and hous hold stuff To Peter Jarboe the
three hundred acres of Land bought or exchanged
with Henry Aspinall by Larence Creek in
Brittains bay with one Negro and equal share
of
