January next and in every ensuing year during the
 Continuance of this Act in the said month of January
 (having summoned every respective or ordinary keeper
 within their respective Counties and City then & there
 to appear before them) to set and assess the rates and
 prizes of all liquors whatsoever (not hereafter in this
 Act mentioned) by them the said ordinary keepers vend
 ed or to be vend ed for the year ensuing and so for
 every year during the Continuance of this Act as afore
 said which said rates and prizes so to be set & assessed
 Dimitted and appointed by the Commissioners afore
 said and by the Magistrates of the City aforesaid shall
 be by their severall Respective Clerks fairly transcrib
 ed and set up at their severall respective County Courts
 and City aforesaid in some publick place or places there
 that any person or persons may see and peruse the same
 for which Summons and table of prizes every ordinary
 keeper shall pay to such Clerk the sume of forty pounds
 of Tobacco and any Ordinary keeper or holder that shall
 after setting and assessing the rates and prizes aforesaid
 directly or indirectly presume to take exact demand or
 receive for the price and pay for any such liquors for
 which the rates and prizes shall be set and assessed
 as aforesaid of any person or persons whatsoever above
 the rates and prizes so to be set and assessed as aforesaid
 shall for every such default forfeit and pay unto the
 Right Hon^{ble} the Lord Proprietary the sume of five hun
 dred pounds of Tobacco one half thereof to his said
 Lordship and the other half to him or them that shall
 informe and sue for the same and lose every such debt
 so unjustly charged exacted and demanded the said
 Forfeiture to be Recovered in any Court of Record within
 this province wherein no esoyne protection or wager
 of Law to be allowed and every such ordinary keeper that
 shall demand exact or receive above the sume of ten
 pounds p Gallon for small beer twenty pounds of
 Tobacco p Gallon for strong beer for a nights lodging in
 a bed four pounds of Tobacco for a peck of Indian shella
 Corn or oats for a horse twelve pounds of Tobacco for
 pasture for a horse p night six pounds of Tobacco for
 hay or straw for a horse p night ten pounds of
 Tobacco
