Justice in the County Courts of this Province  
For the administration of Justice in & Regulation  
of the County Courts Be it enacted by the Right Hon  
the Lord Proprietary by and with the advice & consent  
of the upper and lower houses of this present Genell  
Assembly and the authority of the same that the  
Statute Books of England to these times named  
Shebles abridgement of the Statutes & Dalton's Justice  
of the Peace be Brought by the Justices of the peace or  
Commissioners of the severall County Courts at the chare  
of the Respective Counties to be kept in their severall  
County Courts that the Justices and Officers of the said  
Courts and others may have recourse to the same as  
they shall have occasion and that the said Justices  
of the said Courts do purchase and procure the same  
by the first day of January in the year of our Lord  
one thousand six hundred Seventy and nine  
And Be it also enacted by the authority aforesaid  
that the Commissioners of each Respective County  
Court shall and may and are hereby Imponered  
from time to time and as often as to them shall seem  
convenient to make and ordene such necessary  
Rules and orders for the well governing and better  
Regulating the said County Court and the Officers  
to the same belonging & Subject to the same as to  
them in their Discretion shall seem requisite &  
under such fines as they shall think fit (not ex-  
ceeding one hundred pounds of Tobacco for any  
one
