 Magdelen his wife Anne Peane his
 Daughter and Jacob Lockerman

Humbly sheweth

That your Petitioners James & Magde-

len were borne in France and your Petitioner Jacob
 Lockerman was borne in New York under the Jurisdi-
 ction of the States of Holland and being now removid into
 this province have for divers years therein Inhabited
 being invited to come and dwell within this Province
 by and upon confidence of your Lordships fathers Decla-
 ration of the second of July 1649 whereby your Lordships
 said father did impower his Governor from time to
 time to grant Lands unto any person French dutch
 Spanish or any other Foreigner dissent in the same manner
 in as ample manner and upon the same terms &
 provisoes as he was therby impowered to grant land
 to any person or persons of British or Irish dissent
 during their said abode they have been alwayes
 faithfull and obedient to your Lordships Laws yet
 for that your Petitioners are not of British or Irish
 dissent they cannot take the benefit of the Customs
 and Laws of this Province as other the people of this
 Province
