Rate can be set upon Liquors sold by Ordinary keepers, by reason because no certain Rate can be set upon merchant's goods, from whom the Ordinary keepers must purchase their Liquors. Be it Enacted by y^e R^t Hon^{ble} y^e Lord Prop^r, by, and with y^e authority of y^e upper and Lower houses of this present general Assembly, and y^e authority of y^e same, that (from henceforth) every person be left to agree with y^e Ordinary keepers, for any Liquor, or other accommodations, except Beer, Lodging, Dyott, and horse meat. And Be it further Enacted by y^e authority afores^d, that (from hence forward) no Ordinary keeper shall demand above 10th Tobar. p^r m^oall, for Dyott: For small Beer 10th Tobar. p^r gallon: For strong Beer 20th Tob. p^r gallon: For a night's Lodging in Bed with sheets, 4th Tob. For a Peck of Indian, shelled Corn, or Oats, for a horse 12th of Tob. For Pasture for a horse, 6th Tob. p^r night. For Hay, or Straw for a horse, 10th Tob. p^r night.

And to y^e end that y^e good people of this Province, attending publick Sessions of gen^l Assemblies, as also Prob^l Courts and y^e severall & respective County Courts within this Province being thereunto lawfully called & summoned, may be certain of accommodations sufficient, for their horses, as well as for themselves. Be it Enacted by the authority, advice and consent afores^d, that every Ordinary keeper within this Province, shall (from, and after y^e first day of October next after the Publication hereof) be obliged to provide, & maintain accommodations of Oats, Hay, Straw for Litter, and Indian Corn: together with stable, room convenient, and sufficient for 20 horses, at y^e least: under Penalty of forfeiting & paying y^e sum of 10000th of Tob. One halfe thereof to y^e Lord Prop^r: the other halfe to y^e informer; or him, or them y^e shall sue for y^e same. To be recovered in any Court of Record within the
