to be allowed.

And Be it further Enacted by the authority,  
advice and consent aforesd, That from and after y<sup>e</sup> Publication  
hereof, no Ordinary-keoper shall Creditt any Freeman in  
this Province, not being a freeholder, and depending upon  
his Labour for y<sup>e</sup> paym<sup>t</sup> of his debts, for any sume of  
Tobac<sup>r</sup>, exceeding the sume of 400<sup>lb</sup> of Tob., in any one  
year, upon pain of Loss of his whole debt, whethir due  
by Bill, Bond, or Ano!

And so farasmuch as some strangers travell this  
Province, who have no Tobac<sup>r</sup> in this Province, and others  
that are Inhabitants in this Province, may spend small  
sumes, not amounting to a hhd. of Tobac<sup>r</sup> Be it also Enacted  
by the authority, advice and consent aforesd, That it shall  
be at y<sup>e</sup> Liberty of y<sup>e</sup> person or persons entertained by the  
Ordinary-keoper, to pay as many Pds in money, for Board,  
Dyott, Lodging, Horse, meat, as there are Pounds of Tobacco  
allowed to be demanded by y<sup>e</sup> Ordinary-keoper, for such Board,  
Dyott, Lodging, or Horse-meat, before in this Act mentioned.  
This Act to endure for 3 years, or to y<sup>e</sup> end of y<sup>e</sup> next  
genl Assembly.
