

and in case any shall doe contrary (directly, or indirectly) to this act, shall loose and forfeit to y^e party grieved, trouble damages, and shall also forfeit & sume of six thousand Pounds of Tobac., or 40^{thd} starting for obery time he or they shall so doe y^e contrary: the one moyety to y^e Lord Prop^{ty}, his Heires and Successors; y^e other moyety to y^e party or parties that shall sue for the same by any Plaintiff, Action, suit, Bill or Information, wherw^m no Essoyne, protection or wagar of Law shall be allowed. Provided alwaies, that if any foos for any matter or thing hereafter to be done, belonging to their soberall office or offic^{es}, and by y^e R^t. to the y^e Lord Prop^{ty} or his Lieutent^t, and Gobern^t, and Councell so allowed & adjudged and not in this act mentioned, Limited and allowed, then it shall be Law^c to have & receive such foos as y^e Lord Prop^{ty}, and Councell afford^d shall judge & allow, & no more, under y^e penality afores^d; to be rembered as afford^d.
