

And in case any shall do contrary (directly, or indirectly) to this Act, shall lose and forfeit to y^e party grieved, treble damages, and shall also forfeit y^e sume of six thousand Pounds of Tobar., or 40th sterling for every time he or they shall so do y^e contrary: the one moyety to y^e Lord Prop^rty., his Heires and Successors; y^e other moyety to y^e party or parties that shall sue for the same by any Plaint, Action, suite, Bill or Information: whom no Essoyne, protection or wagar of Law shall be allowed. Provided alwaies, that if any fees for any matter or thing hereafter to be done, belonging to thier severall office or offices, and by y^e R^t. Hon^{ble}. y^e Lord Prop^rty. or his Lieutent., and Governo^r., and Councell so allowed & adjudged and not in this Act mentioned; Limited and allowed, then it shall be Law^{le}. to have & receive such fees as y^e Lord Prop^rty., and Councell aforesd. shall judge & allow, & no more, under y^e penalty aforesd. to be recorded, as aforesd.
