as aforesaid, in such manner, and under such paines, penalties  
and forfeitures as by the said recited act is limited and  
appointed to be payd to the said Cecilius Lord Prop<sup>r</sup> as  
aforesaid.

Provided alwayes notwithstanding that all  
and every the severall provisions in the said act contained  
doe during the continuance of this act stand in full force  
and vertue and be inseparably annexed to this present  
act.

Provided alsoe that from and after y<sup>e</sup> end  
of this present session of gen<sup>l</sup> assembly in Case of  
Shipwrack or taking of any Ship or Shipp, Vessell or  
Vessells soo that the tobaccos soo laden and lost as aforesaid  
shall be Repayd the said duty or imposition of two shillings  
p<sup>r</sup> hhd, or have liberty to shipp at some other time so many  
hhd<sup>s</sup> Tob: as they had formerly payd imposition money as  
aforesaid free and clear any the s<sup>d</sup> imposition. ~

### An Act for the speedy payment of Debts due to the Lord Proprietary.

Be it Enacted by the Lord Proprietary of this Province  
with the Consent and approbation of the upper & Lower  
houses of this Assembly, that all debts w<sup>ch</sup> oither are or  
shall be, ~~are~~ from time to time, really and truly due to  
his Lopp, or his Heires Lords and Prop<sup>r</sup>s of this  
Province shall be first Payd and Satisfyd within the said  
Province, before any other debts whatsoever. ~
