An act concerning Proceedings  
at Law.

Whereas severall Differences doe arise within this Province where there is no Rule or Law provided in the Province, whereby to determine such Differences: and to leave too much to discretion is, to open a gapp to Corruption. For the avoiding such inconveniencies

Be it enacted by the Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup>. by & with the consent of the upper & lower houses of this present year<sup>ly</sup> Assembly, that in all Cases where the Law of this Province is silent, Justice shall be administered according to the Lawes & statutes of England, if pleaded and produced. And all Courts to Judge the right Pleading & Inconsistency of the said Lawes with the good of this Province, according to the best of their Judgment, skill and Cunning.

This Act to continue three yeares, or to the end of the next year<sup>ly</sup> assembly.
