Be it enacted by the Right hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lords Prop<sup>ty</sup>. by  
and with the assent of the upper and lower houses of this  
present gen<sup>l</sup>. Assembly That noo Inhabitant, or Trades  
kithen shall buy or sell or otherwise make use of in trading  
any other Weights or Measures then are used, and made  
according to the Statute of Henry the seventh, King of England  
in that case made and provided.

And for discovery of abuses Bee it further  
Enacted That Daniell Jonitor of St. Marys County,  
Robert Dumm of Kent County, Thomas Jailer of  
Anne Arundell County, Charles Brooks of Calvert  
County, Henry Adams of Charles County, In<sup>o</sup>. Vankirk of  
Baltimore County, W<sup>m</sup>. Lambton of Talbot County, Will<sup>m</sup>.  
Stevens of Somerset County, and Dan<sup>l</sup>. Clarke of Dorchester  
County Gent<sup>l</sup> doe set up a Standard at their own houses, and  
provide by the next shipping or the shipping then next follow  
ing at furthest Twelve halfe hundred weights, a Quarter  
halfe Quarter, seven pounds, four pounds, two pounds,  
one Pound. Alsoe each person above named w<sup>o</sup>. to procure  
six stamps for the marking of Standards and weights, the first  
six to be marked with the Letter A for St. Marys County: the  
next six to be marked with the Letter B for Kent County: y<sup>e</sup> third  
six with the Letter C for Anne Arundell County: the fourth  
six with y<sup>e</sup> Letter D for Calvert County: the fifth six with  
the Letter E for Charles County: the sixth six with the Letter  
F for Baltimore County: the 7<sup>th</sup> with the Letter G for
