

and after the end of this Assembly shall import or bring into this Province, by Sea or Land, any horses, mares, geldings or Colts from any foreign Parts whatsoever, under the penalty of forfeiting all such horses, geldings, mares and Colts so by him or them imported or brought in as aforesaid, on the full value thereof: one half to the Lord Proprietary: the other half to the informer, or him or them that shall seize the same, to be recovered in any Court of Record within this Province by Bill, Plaist or Information wherein no Esquire, Prothonotary or wagon of Law to be allowed. This act to continue for three years, or to the end of the next general Assembly which shall first happen. And for that his Excellency Charles Calvert Esq; Capt: genl: and chieff Governeur under the said Lord Prop: was graciously pleased to prorogue the same Assembly until the tenth day of this instant October, and not to dissolve the same: And for that several doubts and scruples have since the prorogation of the same Assembly arisen, and are like to arise in this Province amongst divers the inhabitants therof touching the time when the said Act should commence and begin to be in force. And for that several numbers and companies of horses have been since the prorogation of the said Assembly, imported and brought into this Province. And whereas at the making of the said Law, it was the intent of the upper and Lower houses of the said Assembly, the said Act should commence and begin to be in force at the day of the end of that Session of Assembly, vizt the 19<sup>th</sup> day of Aprill, in the 39<sup>th</sup> year of his said Lordships dominion over this Province, anno Dom. 1671. Therefore for the full explanation as well of the said Act, as of all other Laws then made and enacted at the aforesaid Sessions of Assembly.
