Act for marking High Wayes, and  
making the heads of Ribors, Crookes, Branches,  
and Swamps passable for horse and foot.

Whereas it is thought convenient, and very much for  
the benefit of the inhabitants of this Province that Wayes and  
Paths be marked, and the heads of Ribors, Crookes and Branches  
be made Passable. Bee it therefore Enacted by the  
Right hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup>, by and with the Consent of the upper  
and lower houses of this present gen<sup>e</sup>l Assembly, That the  
Commission<sup>s</sup> of every County shall once every year, viz<sup>t</sup> upon some  
day between the first day of Septembre and the twentieth day of  
October, as the said Justices or Commission<sup>s</sup> shall think fit to appoint,  
meet together in their respective Counties, to consult of what high-  
wayes are most fit to be made; and cause to be marked out the most  
convenient high-wayes and Pathes through their Counties: as also  
to make passable for horse and foot the heads of Ribors, Crookes,  
Branches and Swamps as are most convenient, and nearest adjoyning  
to such high-wayes and necessary Pathes. And the said Commission<sup>s</sup>  
are hereby empowered to appoint Overseers, ready labour, or  
Labour equally upon the taxable<sup>d</sup> of each respective County to  
carry on the said work; to begin, or to repair high-wayes already  
made or begun. Provided that this Act bee not to the apparent  
damage of any particular person, by making or marking any  
high-waye or Path through his yard, garden, Orchard, or Corn field.  
And upon neglect of the Commission<sup>s</sup> for appointing Overseers, and  
providing Labourers for the performance of the said work, they  
shall be fined 4000<sup>l</sup> sterl. and Casks. And every Labourer who  
shall refuse or neglect, or refuse his Labour shall be fined 1000<sup>l</sup> of  
sterl. and Casks. And every Overseer so appointed by the said Commission<sup>s</sup>  
who shall refuse or neglect the performance of his duty and his charge  
shall be fined 2000<sup>l</sup> sterl. The one halfe of those fines to the Lord  
Prop<sup>ty</sup>, the other halfe to the informer; or him or them that shall  
sue for the said fine or fines, to be recovered in any Court of  
record within this Province by Bill, Plaintiff, or otherwise, wherein  
no Escompt, Protection or wager of Law to be allowed. This act  
to endure for three years, or to the end of the next Sessions of  
Assembly which shall first happen. And Bee it further  
Enacted that all former Lawes heretofore made touching the marking  
high wayes be, and are hereby Repealed.
