

shall be confessed as aforesaid shall Rotorne tho Judgement soe  
confessed unto the Clerke of that resportive Court where tho first  
Judgement was obtained, to be entered upon Record, for which entry  
the Clerke shall receyve as a fee, fiftie pounds of tobacco and no  
more, any Law, Custome or usage heretofore had, made, or done  
within this Province, to the contrary therof notwithstanding.

And Bee it furthor Enacted by the authority aforesaid  
that all Lawes heretofore made for the Limiting and stayng  
Exactions to and are hereby repealed. This act to continue and  
remain in force for the term of three yeare, or to the end of the  
next Sessions of Assembly which shall first happen.

**An Act concerning the impannelling  
the Grand Inquests in the severall Countie  
within this Province.**

Whereas the Delegates in this present generall  
Assembly, considering the great Charge the severall  
Counties in this Province are put unto in bearing the charges  
of their severall grand Inquests wch are twice in every year  
sumoned to enquire of offences and misdemeanors committed in  
their severall Counties agt his Majestys peace, doo humbly pray  
that it may be enacted, and

Bee it by the Right honble the Lord Proprietary and with  
the advice and consent of the upper and Lower houses of this present  
genell Assembly, and the authority of the same Enacted That  
from and after the Publication hereof, all and every person or  
persons that shall hereafter be summond by the severall Sheriffs  
within this Province to appear in the severall County Courts as  
grand Inquests, to enquire as aforesaid, shall bear and defray  
the expence and charge of his and their own severall attendants  
at such County Courts, without charging any thing upon the  
severall Counties for such their charge and attendants.

And so the end that no person may be overburthened  
therby, It is further Enacted by the authority aforesaid  
that no person shall be twice summond in one year to be one  
of the said grand inquests; and that the Sheriff aforesaid shall  
not cause any person to be summond and impannelled to seruo
