An act for Surveyors & gencrall^ls ffees; with
additions of ffees upon resurveyors, and for Leaving
the same.

Whereas much as the sev'ral Lawes hitherto made for the regulating
of Surveyors ffees, have (by daily experience) been found uneffectuall to
restraine the exorbitant exactions of the sev'ral Deputy Surveyors, to the
great damage, detriment and vexation of the good people of this Province.

Bee it therofore enacted by the Right Hon^{ble} the Lord Proprietary
by and with the advice and consent of the upper and Lower houses of
this present gen^tl^e Assembly, that from and after the publication hereof
the Surveyor^l gen^l, nor any of his Deputies for the time being shall ask
demand, receyve any other ffee, gratuity or reward for any matter
concerning the office of Surveyor^l than such as are by this present act
prohibited for, allowed and expressed, (that is to say)

For surveying of any plott of ground of one hundred acres or under, one £¹⁰
per acre.

If the Plott be between one hundred and two hundred acres, then for the first
one hundred acres as aforesaid, and for all above, halfe a pound of tobacco per acre.

If between two hundred and fife hundred acres, then for the first two hundred
as before, and for all above one quarton of a Pound of tobacco per acre.

If it be between 500 and 1000 acres, then for the first fife hundred acres
as aforesaid, and for any quantitie above 500 acres, one Pound of tobacco
for every 1000 acres, and noo more.

For entering a Survey upon the Book, fife Pounds of tobacco.

For certifying the same, 5^{ds} tobacco.

For describing a Plott of the ground surveyed, if it be one hundred acres
or under, 10^{ds} tobacco.

If it be above 100 acres, then 5^{ds} tobacco for evry hundred acres.

For going to make such a Survey, if the place be distant from his usual
habitation 20 miles or under, 40^{ds} tobacco. If above 20 and under 40 miles
dixty Pounds of tobacco and 500 pro rato for any great quantitie.

And that for evry Resurvey to be made for any person whatsoeuer, sum
resurvey being made with a Chaine Circumfowntion with sights and ~
