

Antinomian, Barrowist, Round-head, Separatist, or any other name or title,
 in a reproachful ~~or~~ manner relating to matter of Religion, shall for
 obury such offence forfeit and loose the sume of tenn shillings sterl.
 or the value therof, to be levied on the goods and Chattels of the
 such offendore and offendours, the one halfe therof to be forfeited and
 payd unto the person and persons of whom such reproachfull words are
 or shall be spoken or uttered, and the other halfe to the Lord Prop.
 and his heires Lord & Prop. of this Province. But if such person or
 persons who shall at any time utter or speak any such reproachfull
 words or language shall not have goods & Chattels sufficient and obury
 within this Province to be taken to satisfie the penality aforesaid, or
 that the same be not otherwise speedily satisfied, that then the person
 or persons so offending shall publikely be whipt & shall suffer
 imprisonment without Baile or mainprize untill he, she or they re-
 spectiveley shall satisfie the party so offendore by such reproachfull
 language, by asking him or her respectively forgivness for such his
 offence before the Magistrate or chiefe officer or officers of the town or
 place where such offence shall be giben. And

Be it further likewise Enacted by the authority and consent
 aforesaid, that obury person and persons within this Province that
 shall at any time hereafter profane the Sabbath or Lord's Day called
 Sunday by frequent swearing drunkeyness, or by any uncibill or
 disorderly recreacion, or by working on that day, when absolute necess
 doth not require it, shall for obury such first offence forfeit 2⁶ d.
 sterling, or the value therof, and for the second offence 5⁸ sterling, or
 the value therof, and for the third offence, and so for obury time he shall
 offend in the like manner afterwards tenn shillings sterling, or the value
 therof. And if such offendore or offendours shall not have goods & Chattels
 sufficient within this Province to satisfie any of the said penalties
 respectively hereby imposed for profaning the Sabbath or Lord's Day
 called Sunday as aforesaid, that in obury such case the party so
 offending shall for the first and second offence in that kinde be imprisoned
 till he or she shall publikely in open Court before the chiefe Comand
 Judge or Magistrate of that County, Town or prouincet whereon such
 offence shall be committed acknowledge the offence he hath in that respect
 giben agt God & the good Civil government of this Province, and for
 the third offence, and for obury time after shall be publikely whipt.
 And whereas the onforoing of the ~~reverend~~ Consciencie in matters of
 Religion hath frequently fallen out to be of dangerous consequence
