

Ababro, Watsawap and Toquasino, and the people under their gods or charge, and their heirs for ever, any Law, usage, Custom or usage to the contrary hereto in any wise notwithstanding, To be hold of the Lord Prop^r and his heirs Lords and Prop^rs of this Province, under the year Rent of six Beaver skins, to be paid to his said Lord^r and his heirs, as other Rents in this Province by the English use to be paid.

And Be it further enacted by the authority, advice & consent aforesaid, that it shall and may be Lawfull for the Governour of this Province for the time being to raise out of this Province such and so much tobacco, by an equal assessment upon the estates of the freemen of this Province as he shall see out of purpose in procuring a League with the Matwas Indians, in which the said Ababro, Watsawap & Toquasino & their people and Subjects shall be included. Provided the said League be had and concluded within three years next ensuing from the Last day of this present general Assembly.

An act for the encouragement of such persons as will undertake to build Water-Mills.

Daily experience showing that the want of ^{water-}Mills is the true Cause that husbandry in tilling of ground for and sowing of wheat and Barley is but coldly prosecuted, though the advantages thereby in raising a Stock of Neat, Cattle, be great. And forasmuch as, for the most part, the places fitt for setting up of Water-Mills, are already in the hands of ^{some} under age, or unable to be at the ~~price~~ charge of building Water-Mills, also of such as are wilfully obstinate in forbidding and hindering of such persons as would purchase the said places fitt for building the said water mills, and set them up, to the increase of our trade, and navigation, much to the publick damage.

The freemen of this present general Assembly doe pray that it may be Enacted, And

Be it Enacted by the Right hon^{ble} the Lord Prop^r, by and with the advice and consent of the upper and Lower houses of this present general Assembly, & by the authority of the said ^{Assembly} that if any person or persons
