That y^e Justices of the County Courts shall take able & sufficient security & Orphans estates, & inquire yearly of y^e security: & if y^e Justice see
soe cause to have it changed, then to be called in, & to be put into y^e hands
of such as y^e Justice shall think fitt, y^e Justice to enquire whom
y^e orphans be kept, maintained & educated, according to their estates: &
they finde any notorious defect, to removē them to other Guardians. And ag
for those that are bound apprentices, to change their master, if they use
them rigorously, or neglect to teach them their trades.

That no more be allowed Guardians for collecting debts due to any estate than
toun in y^e hundred, the usuall allowance of merchants to their factors
& attorneyes.

That Thirty pounds of tobacco per day be allowed to each appraiser of any
estate (if they will take it) & no more.

That no allowance be made by y^e Coēt of excessivo funerall expences, but
that a regulation therof be made, according to y^e proportion of the
estate, & quality of y^e person.

April 1666. An act for appointing Coronors in each respective County.

Whereas there haue many inconveniences happened in this Province for
want of appointing Coronors in each County.

Be it therefore enacted by y^e R^t hon^{ble} y^e L^r Proprietary of this Province
w^t y^e assent of y^e upper & lower houses of this gen^l Assembly that y^e hon^{ble}
y^e Lt^r gen^l for y^e time being doo constitute & appoint such pson or psns
from tyme to tyme, to be Coronors, as he shall judge most ablo. & best
qualified for that office, in each respetive County in this Province, and

Be it further enacted that y^e Lt^r gen^l give out Comissions to such
psns to y^e intent & purpos as aforesd. & y^e same (as near as may be)
may concurre w^t y^e Lawes & constitution^s of England: & that an Oath
be administered to obey such Coronor by appointment of y^e Lt^r gen^l, at
their entring into y^e office, according to y^e form of y^e oath of a Coronor
in England.

April 1666 An act for confirmation of the Articles of peace made
with the Indians.

Whereas by Articles of peace drawn & concluded on by y^e grand
Committee of both houses of this present gen^l Assembly, & y^e 20th day of
April 1666 signed by y^e hon^{ble} y^e Gouvernor & as many of y^e great men
of Pascataway, Narostance, Tico Doags, Mikikinoman, Manasquie, Mattawoman,
Chingwanatwick, Nangomarick, Portoback, Saetas, &c.
