

An Act Imposing A Penalty On all Such who shall Dispose of Tobb seized & Recd by Sherriffe & Others

Whereas divers great Grievances have happened in this Province through many Cheates & Deceites of many have used in disposing of & Altring & March Qualities of Tobb after the said Tobb have been found & Recd by the Sherriffe either for James Leavies or his Legall Heire or hath been carryed away to Merchants or others and by them Marched & Recd & thereby both the Publique hath been much abused & wronged & many private persons have had great Damages in their goods & Be it therefore Enacted by the Hon^{ble} the Prop^{ty} by the Advice & Consent of the Lower Houses of this present Gov^{ts} Assembly of what persons soever shall dispose of Tobb or other goods found or Recd by the Sherriffes for James Leavies or his Legall Heire or other other Publique Officers goods or if shall Altring or Marched out the March of any Tobb so Recd or if shall Altring or change the quality of Tobb so Recd or by any Merchant or other Recd either by unreasoning or otherwise without Lawfull Order or warrant in writing and hand of such Sherriffe as who Recd the same or of such Merchant or other person as who had Recd & Marched the same or for whose use the same was Recd & Marched shall be liable being convicted by Confession or sufficient Witnesses in some Court of this Province to Restore said goods to the Gov^{ts} & to stand in the Pillory two full hours during the Court time with his Office fairly written in a piece of Paper & placed upon his back Provided no person shall be Impleaded or Prosecuted upon this Act after twelve months from the time of the Fact shall be Comitted Provided also if this Act shall Continue for three years or to the end of the next Gov^{ts} Assembly

Be it Enacted by the Hon^{ble} the Prop^{ty} by the Advice & Consent of the Upper & Lower Houses of this present Gov^{ts} Assembly & authority of the same that One Act made at the Gov^{ts} Assembly begun & solemnized the tenth of April One Thousand six hundred sixty & One Entituled an Act for Appointing Certain Officers, Excepting the last Clause therein contained & One other Act made at the same Assembly Entituled an Act concerning the height of Fences, One other Act made at the same Assembly Entituled an Act for Conveyance of all Letters concerning the Trade & Publique Affairs, One other Act made at the Gov^{ts} Assembly hold at St. Maries the first day of April 1662 Entituled an Act concerning Indians, One other Act made at a Gov^{ts} Assembly hold at St. Maries & Fifteenth of September in the year One Thousand six hundred sixty & three & there continued in
