

within the province as aforesaid or being examined  
re: Memoriam That then every person or persons so offending  
thereof duly convicted or attainted by the Laws of this province shall  
for his or their Offence loose and forfeit Twenty pounds Sterling and  
suffer Imprisonment the Space of Six months without Baile or main-  
-prise, And the Oaths of such person or persons so offending from thence-  
-forth not to be received in any Court of Record within this province until  
Such time as the Judgem: against any such person or persons shall be  
reversed by Attaint or otherwise as aforesaid, And that upon every such  
Reversall the parties grieved to recover their Damages as aforesaid. And  
if it happon that the Offendor or Offenders so offending shall not have Goods  
and Chattels to the Value of Twenty pounds then he she or they shall be  
Lett on the pillory next adjoining to the place where he she or they shall  
be Convict as aforesaid and to have both ears Nailed, and to seem thence-  
-forth to be discreditte and disabled for ever to be Sworne in any the  
Courts of Record aforesaid until such time as the said Judgem: be reversed  
upon which he she or they shall recover his her or their Damages in  
manner and forme as is before mentioned the one Moiety of all the said  
Fines and forfeitures to be to our Sovereigne Lord and Lady y King  
and Queen for the Supporte of Governem: and the other Moiety to such  
Person or persons as shall be grieved hindered or molested by reason of  
any the Offence or Offences before mentioned that will sue for the Same  
by Action of Debt Bill plaint or Information or otherwise in any  
of Record within this province where no Effoyn protection or way  
of Law shall be allowed And do it further enacted by us  
aforesaid That if any person or persons upon whom any process  
of any the Courts of Record within this Province shall be served  
Testify or Depose Concerning any Cause or Matter depending  
of the Same Courts relating to the premises and having an
