

Granted any Land Ex mero Motu de Gratia Specialia -
And whereat by this Act is provided that if any man hold
fifte & one above his Number of porches betwixt his known
bounds he shall maintaine the same agaynt any taker taken
up the same and will not resurvey his Land in the time, but that
the Lord Proprietor grant the Purplage to another yet
if the first taker up have beaten his plantation and made
his Improvement after the certaine number of porches is -
determined yet the Purplage shall not be paid to the Person
only after such determination of such Number of porches
because after the Surveyor hath once by description as it
were map'd the Land it is then all granted at one time
plate and the Purplage shall be assigned by a Jury -
entirely to lie together but to the last determinent of
the first Grantee and if a certaine Number of porches -
in any case be prescribed to run by a Creek River or
Branch Side and no markt tree nor certaine Course -
express the said Number of porches shall not be spent
away by the severall windings of the River Creek or
Cove but brought to a straight line of thal Branch or
and be regulated by the other porches as midlest cases
is provided. If Land be bounded by a Creek or running
a certaine course or Number of porches as Supose North one
hundred porches if thal Branch Creek or Cove were cut
and Expire or unreasonably winds above five points
from the Course into the Land before the Number of
porches be determined so that there be no certaine
running. Eastward Stream or certaine Bed or Branch
