

There to Such a Windings at aforesaid w^t Coursing
 to the Bounds from the Beginning to the Ending. Provided in
 all the adjacent Landes between the Creek and the River before
 comes to Land over the Branch Creek or Coo shall be added the
 Lakes to be part of the Land, that is, so far as the Creek inclines
 as in the Ninth Example. If Land begin at a Market Tree
 by a River Creek Branch or Coo and go up or down the said
 River Creek Branch or Coo to an other Market tree at the mouth of
 a Creek or Coo to another market tree at the mouth of a Creek or
 Coo and then be prescribed to run a certain Course and number
 of Pordes by the said Creek or Coo and the Spreading away of the
 Number of Pordes upon the winding of the said Creek or Coo would
 shun the Cours from Extending farr enough into the Woods and the
 Creek winds outwards from the Land and Varying from the Course
 in this East the first line and prescribed shall be run out and from
 the end of that line shall be drawn a line reverse to the next course
 which is to be run till the same reverse Intersects the said Creek or Coo
 and by that intersection it shall describe how farre that Trail shall
 be bounded by the Creek or and the rest of the bounds shall in such
 case be Ascertained by the fourth Example. as Suppose from the
 second Tree at the mouth of a Coo or the line prescribed East
 one hundred and Sixty pordes by the Coo and bounded by the Coo
 and the said Creek winds away East North East and East line of
 one hundred and Sixty pordes shall be run out and if coming
 of the East line the course should be South then there shall be
 a line drawn North to the Coo and that North line shall
 off the place where it intersects the Coo how farre that
 shall be bounded by the Coo and then at the intersection
 South line shall be begun and continued till it Intersects
