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Owner of the Second Tract shall hold all that is free of the former Survey and all former Survey taken or ever in either Part for the same is not Granted poach by poach at the Surveyor's Measures it bid. Grant is unto Estate all at once of every part of it And if any man or Tree or Trees stand within another man's Land the Owner of the said Land whose Land the said Tree stand shall not on any pretence Cut down or destroy the said Tree or Trees Except he first give Notice to the Owner of that Land whose Bound such Tree is, and there with present either plant other sufficient Larch or Cedar post or Stone or Horns in the Road and place of that Tree under the penalty of Five pounds Sterling to be paid to the party whose Bounds the said Tree was to be recovered by Action of Debt ye. And it is hereby made Lawfull for every man having such Tree or Trees within another man's Land and having a Speciall Warrant of Survey or Order of Provinciall Court for resurvey, or order of County Court for Survey of their Land to Ascertein his Bounds having Asked leave and being denied with Surveyor Jury witness and Name affixed to such Land wherein or wherewill his Marked tree stands and from such Marked Tree measure his course and distance required provided he makes all fences at good and tighe as they were found and that he nor any one along with him in Measuring the same do not manifest damage Detiment or Harm to the Owner of the Land wherein they goe or if accidentally any damage happen that then in such Case he proffer and within three days make reparation and Amend **AND** be it Enacted by the same aforesaid That no man shall have more than  $\frac{1}{4}$  Part of an Acre in a precise Number of Poles Except it be by Natural Accidence of Land Cont to reach to a Market Tree or other Tree
