# An Act for the speedy tryall of

Criminals and ascertaining their punishments in County Courts  
when prosecuted there.

Whereas many acts of Assembly have been heretofore made against  
Theiving and Stealing which at this present are not sufficient to prevent  
the committing those Crimes or to punish them when committed.

Be it therefore Enacted by the Queens most excellent Ma-  
jesty by and with the Advice and Consent of Her Majestys Governor and Coun-  
cil and Assembly of this Province and the Authority of the same That it  
shall and may be lawfull to and for the severall Justices of the County Courts  
of this Province to hold plea of adjudge and in lawful manner determine all
