

106 Be granted in his her or their Houses or about his her or their plantations
upon forfeiture of every time he she or they shall be legally convicted thereof
the sum of one thousand pounds of Tobacco One half thereof to her Majesty —
her heirs and Successors for and towards the Defraying the County Charge —
where such forfeiture shall become due and the other half to such Informer or
to him or them that shall sue for the same to be recovered in any Court of Record
within this province by Action of Debt Debt Plaint or Information without nec-
essary prohibition or Wager of Law to be allowed.

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid —
by and with the Advice and Consent aforesaid that no person or persons —
whatsoever be licensed to keep Ordinary as aforesaid shall refuse to credit
any person Capable of giving a Vote for Election of Delegates in any County
within this province to the value of four hundred pounds of Tobacco
per Annum for any Accommodation by him vendid or otherwise of any such
person so capacitated as aforesaid shall have occasion of or require to —
be accommodated withall under the penalty or forfeiture of four hundred —
pounds of Tobacco by each Ordinary Keeper so refusing to credit such person
as aforesaid One moiety thereof to her Majesty her heirs and Successors for
and towards the Defraying the County Charge where such forfeiture shall
become due the other moiety to the Informer or him or them that shall sue
for the same to be recovered as aforesaid.

And whereas it hath been found prejudicial to the —
Inhabitants of this province that Ordinary Keepers and Inholders have —
frequently entertained divers free men and loose persons a great time
tripping at their houses as well to the great damage of many persons
as their own ruin.

Be it therefore enacted by the Authority aforesaid by —
and with the Advice and Consent aforesaid that it shall not be —
lawfull for any such ordinary Keeper or Inholder to keep such Ordinary
or house of Entertainment until they have entered into Recognizance —
before the Justice of each respective County granting such Recognizance with two
sufficient Sureties to the value of twenty pounds that they shall not
entertain any free man or other loose person in their houses above twenty
four hours (Equal times excepted) unless such person be Capable to give his
Vote for a Delegate in the said County or that he be retained as a servant to
(the said
