And whereas daily experience sheweth great prejudice to the
Bombers and Masters of Merchant Ships and Vessels trading unto this province
by Ordinary Coopers entertaining of Taylors and others to such Ships and Vessels
belonging and trusting and encouraging them to continue staying in their
hours to the prejudice of Trade within this province provoking and impeding
the dispatch of such Ships and Vessels and very often when such Taylors have
spent their wages in such ordinary occasions and induced them to run away
and desert the Ships and Vessels whereunto they belong for the prosecution whereof

Be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the
advice and consent of the Queen's Governor Council and Assembly of this
Province and the authority of the same that no Ordinary Cooper whatsoe'er
within this Province shall presume to Harbour or Entertain such Taylors to
the neglect of their service to their respective Masters and prejudice to the
dispatch of any Ship or Vessel thereby unduly sparing and penalty of being
suspended from keeping such Ordinary. And that no Ordinary Cooper whatsoever
shall credit such Taylors for more than five Shillings during any one voyage under
the penalty of loosing his Debt and being fined for our Lady the Queen her Heires
and Successors the sum of five pounds for & without one half to the Master of such
vessel where such Ordinary Cooper shall live towards the Defraying the charge
charge to be recovered in any Court of Record of this Province by Bill plaint for Informa-
tion wherein no assay or prosecution or longer of Law to be allowed.

And Lastly Enacted by the Authority aforesaid by and with
the advice and consent aforesaid that the Justices of the Provincial Court and the
Justices of the respective County Courts shall give this Act an Charge to the several
Grand Juries and to their several and respective Constables in their said
Countys to inquire into the breach of this Act and into all disorder committed within
the said Ordinary and present the same if any be to the several Courts to be
examined and punished according to Law. This Act to endure for three years
and to the end of the next Sessions of Assembly which shall happen after
the end of the said three years.
