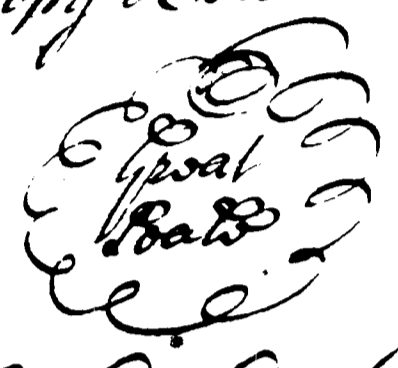

An Act for the Recording of all the Acts

of Assembly of this province in the Secretary's Office as also transmitting of the Journal of the House of Delegates into the said Office

Another Law of the same tenor being made in 1705 this was Repealed

Be it Enacted by the Queen's most excellent Majesty by and with the Advice and Consent of Her Majesty's Honourable Council and Assembly of this province and the Authority of the same that all the Acts of Assembly which shall be enacted this present Session and all the succeeding Sessions of Assembly shall within ten days after the end of each Session be transmitted into the Secretary's Office and the Secretary for the time being shall upon receipt of the said Acts into his Office cause the said Acts to be entered upon Record in a very fair Book of hand and in a good substantial Book bound with leather or parchment cover with large Margerets and also Alphabet the said Book in good order and Affix the Seal of his Office thereto and the Clerk or Clerks that do record the said Acts shall make oath before the Governor of this province for the time being or before one of Her Majesty's Council or two of the Justices of the provincial Court that he or they have carefully examined the Record of the said Acts by the Original Acts which have past the great Seal
