Enacted — An Act for killing of wolves and crows.

Be it Enacted by the Queen's most excellent Majesty by and
 with the Advice and Consent of her Majesty's Governor Council and Assembly of
 this province and the authority of the same that every person that shall bring
 the head of a wolf to any of the Justices of peace in any County within this
 province shall be allowed two hundred pound. of Tobacco from the County where
 the wolf shall be killed and that such Justice of peace to whom the wolf
 head shall be brought shall cut out a Cause to be cut out the Tongue and put a
 Cause to be
