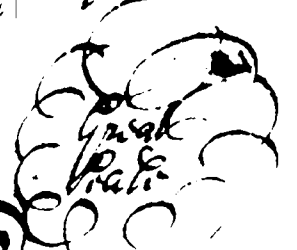

Be it Enacted by the Queen's most excellent Majesty by and
