

89 any Navigation Bond put in Suite either with the
Suite of the said Bonds, lodged in the Secretarys Office of this Province
it can be proved that the same was such Certificate returned
the said Attorney General Receives or have any Fee for any
Days when the said Bond appears next to be forfeited and if the said
General after the end of this Session of Assembly shall see any Bond
contrary to Act of Parliament or any Bond taken for Custom Duty and
Bills of Exchange appearing protested nor nor other failure to forfeit the
Bond, or when the said Certificate is returned into the said Secretarys Office
appointed for keeping the same any of which Cases appearing to the provin-
cial Court the said Attorney General shall not entitle to his Fees but pay
the Secretarys Fees and what other Charges the party shall be at in defend-
ing the same to be adjudged by the provincial Court.

And whereas severall persons have been sued in Her Majestys Name
for a certain time without ever mentioning for which the said Bond was taken
so that the persons do not know what Courses to take or who to apply to

Be it enacted by the Authority aforesaid that when any Writ is issued for
upon a Navigation Bond taken in Her Majestys Name it shall be endorsed on the back
thereof as followeth for whom the person was bound and in what year if a Sheriff
Bond as who's request and prayer it was sued or Bond taken in any of Her Maj-
estys Offices if this provided it shall be endorsed at who's request it was sued, and for
want of such endorsement the writ shall abate, and the party provided shall recover
his Costs against the Attorney that sued for the said Writ.

And Be it enacted by the Authority aforesaid by and with the Advice
and Consent aforesaid that whensoever the Grand Jury in their respective Counties
of this Province shall make apprehension of the breach of any the Laws of this
Province save only the Act for speedy tryall of Crimnals and ascertaining their
punishment in the County Courts when prosecuted there if the party or parties
Conspire to hide their funds and submit to the Court then the Court of Judicature
shall have one hundred pounds of Tobacco for his Fee and no more
The Court of Judicature draws a Bill of Indictment upon the said persons
The party leaves for such apprehension or Bill of Indictment and pays
