

Act for confirming the bounds of a
certain tract of land to the use of the Nanticoke Indians
so long as they shall occupy and live upon the same.

It being most just that the Indians the ancient inhabitants
of this province should have a convenient dwelling place in their
their Native Country free from the Inroachments and Oppressions
of the English more especially the Nanticoke Indians in Dorchester
County who for these many years have lived in peace and Concord
with the English And in all matters in obedience to the Government
of this province. We the Burgesses of this present general assembly
therefore do pray that it may be enacted and

Be it Enacted by the Diverse most Excellent Majesty
by and with the Advice and Consent of her Majestys Honorable
Council and Assembly of this province and the Authority
of the same that all the land lying and being in Dorchester
County And on the North side of Nanticoke River between and
bounded as followeth **Beginning** at the mouth of
Peehawan Creek and running upon the said Creek bounded
thence with to the head of the main branch of the same and from
the head of the said main branch with a line drawn to the
head of a branch issuing out of the North west fork of Nanticoke
River by the name of Francis Andersons branch and from
the head of the said branch down the said Andersons branch
bounded thence with to the mouth of the same where it falls into
the said North west fork And from thence down the aforesaid North west
fork bounded thence with to the main River and so down the aforesaid main
River to the mouth of the ~~same~~ ^{aforesaid Creek} ~~where it falls into the said~~ Creek shall be
confirmed and assured and by virtue of this Act is confirmed and assured unto
Wanyash and Ametoughquan and the people under their
Gods
